New Scholarship Application (College-Bound Students)

REQUIREMENTS:

To be considered for the Fall 2017 scholarship, applications (with all supporting documentation) must be submitted by 8PM on **April 13, 2017**. **ONLY complete applications will be considered. The scholarship process is competitive and a completed application does not guarantee that you receive an award.** To qualify for a scholarship students MUST meet the following requirements:

- Interview about education goals (with Leslie Colon Healy)
- High School Diploma, GED, or Completed Credential Evaluation
- Proficiency: ESL 8 completion or TEAL Test score of 70% or GED Language Arts score of 150
- Having passed two (2) consecutive Carlos Rosario semesters (must finish current semester if enrolled)
- Proof of 75% attendance during the current semester (request through current teacher)
- Proof of submitted application to higher education (Community College or University)
- Proof of application to FAFSA (if eligible)
- Fill in financial worksheet. This worksheet will provide detailed estimated cost of tuition and extras and a plan to cover tuition expenses for the duration of the course of study
- Letter of recommendation from a current Carlos Rosario School teacher
- Letter of recommendation from your employer or friend
- Completed Essay #1: Explain why you want to pursue further studies (**200 words – Please use a computer to complete the essay**)
- Completed Essay #2: Explain your involvement in the Carlos Rosario community and how you plan to work with the school as a Carlos Rosario Scholar (**100 words – Please use a computer to complete the essay**)
- Submit all the documents above to the Student Transition Services Manager (applications must be hand-delivered)
