This fall season we took proactive steps to keep our students, faculty and staff healthy by offering flu shots through a partnership with the Office of Latino Affairs (OLA) and Walgreens. Culinary Students Share a Tasty Seasonal Dessert: Individual Apple and Pear Upside-down Biscuit Cakes

Preheat oven to 350 degrees

Caramel Syrup

½ cup - Brown Sugar
½ cup - Butter
¼ cup - Corn Syrup

Combine three in small sauce pan and bring to a boil over medium heat. Turn off heat and set aside once boiling.



Fruit

2 Apples - Peeled, Cored and Medium Diced
2 Pears - Peeled, Cored and Diced and Medium Diced
3 Tablespoons - Butter
½ teaspoon - Cinnamon

Melt the butter in a sauté pan, sauté apples and pears in butter until just tender and toss with cinnamon.

Cakes

8 biscuits
Non-Stick Spray
Large Muffin Pan

Grease pan. Place 2 Tablespoons of caramel syrup in muffin pan. Split fruit mixture between muffin pan being sure to leave space at the top for biscuits to sit inside.

Cook until top is golden brown and filling is bubbling. Remove from oven and let rest for 5 minutes. Invert onto a cookie sheet. Serve while still warm with fresh whipped cream or a small scoop of ice cream.
